








Teacher Update: 1st Grade

The 6-8 grade Bible students continued to survey the books of the New Testament. February featured the books of First and Second Corinthians, the vital truths of the Resurrection (1 Corinthians 15: 1-8) and the supremacy of agape love (1 Corinthians 13) were studied. According to Second Corinthians 5:20, as Christians, we are ambassadors for Christ. These truths and 1 Corinthians 10:31 were emphasized with the encouragement for personal application.

The 9/10 grade Bible students have delved into Colossians 3: 18-24. This is a rich passage that mainly speaks about family relationships and motivations behind attitudes and actions toward those in authority over us. These vital relationships can be ones of harmony and unity if we "put on" love (Colossians 3:14) at home, school and the workplace.

The 11/12 grade apologetic students have continued to study two vital topics in defending the Faith: Ten Reasons Why We Know that the New Testament Writers were Telling the Truth and How We Know that Jesus Really Rose from the Dead. They wrote two major papers or slide presentations on these topics. More than anything, it is hoped that each student will stand strong in the faith, and be respectful ambassadors for our LORD.

All Bible students have a challenge to independently read through as much of the New Testament as possible. They will take time in class or during time in tutorials after assignments are completed.

BAND MEMBERS MAKE PMEA REGION BAND Trombonist Caeden King, grade 12, and saxophonist Kaeden Parks, grade 11, auditioned for and won seats in the PMEA 2021 Region II Band, which represents an area of 13 western Pennsylvania counties. It is especially amazing to realize that Caeden King only started playing the trombone in 10th grade! These young men are currently diligently working on their music for the up-coming State Band auditions. In recent years Seeds Of Faith has had a remarkably high number of band members qualify for Region Band and Orchestra for the small size of our school, including Kaiya Parks 2017-18-19, Casidhe Shetter 2017-18-19, Daniel Sung 2017-18-19, Tracy Liu 2018-19-20, Kaitlyn Smith, 2018, Jocelyn Sung 2019, Caeden King 2020-21, and Kaeden Parks 2020-21. Several of these students also auditioned at the final level and made State Band or State Orchestra, including Kaiya Parks (2x), Casidhe Shetter (3x), Daniel Sung, Tracy Liu (3x), and Kaeden Parks (2x).

SEEDS OF FAITH IS HONORED AS KAEDEN PARKS BECOMES THE FIRST SAXOPHONIST IN DISTRICT 3 TO MAKE PMEA STATE JAZZ BAND IN 15 YEARS On February 5 it was announced on the Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association website that Kaeden Parks was one of only two alto saxophonists in the entire state of Pennsylvania to qualify for the State Jazz Band. Considering the size of our school this accomplishment, especially noting that Kaeden is only in 11th grade, goes way beyond remarkable. District 3 covers 7 counties, and the last saxophonist to make the state jazz band in our district was in 2006. And this year, Kaeden is the only band student to make the state jazz band on any instrument in Region 2, which covers 13 counties, extending up to Erie County.
