
### School Delays

## Teacher Update: 2nd Grade

We finished our Social Studies book in the middle of January and are excited to have begun Science. The first thing we learned about is what scientists do and that God's creation points us to God. Then we had a lot of fun learning about dinosaurs and fossils. We discussed how our view of God's Word affects our view of fossils and dinosaurs. Second grade learned that many fossils were formed during the Flood. During this unit, we even got to dig for fossils! We had to dig the fossil (cherry) out of a rock (bon bon cookie). We ended the unit with a "Bag of Bones" activity. When scientists find dinosaur bones, they seldom find the bones together. They must try to figure out how the bones fit to form a skeleton. The students were given a bag of bones (pasta noodles) and had to build a dinosaur skeleton. Some of the students even choose to name their dinosaur.

In Bible, we began a new unit on the Biblical truth: Jesus died to restore fellowship and harmony between people and God. In our last unit we learned that sin causes separation and disharmony between people and God. Students are learning the only way we can come back into fellowship with God is by repenting and receiving Jesus Christ as our Savior. When Jesus died on the cross, he restored harmony between God and us.



# Middle School and High School Updates:

We are excited to announce that the 5th through 12th grade students had the opportunity to sign up for a school club. The clubs being offered are Nature Club, Student Newsletter/Newspaper Club, Games Club, and STEM Club. Clubs will meet once a month and you can find a description of each one below.

In the newsletter/newspaper club, we will work collaboratively to create the monthly newsletter. The newsletter will feature descriptions from each teacher about current activities and events. In this club we will be using shared Google Drives and documents, you may need to take photos at time, as well as make sure we create and design a good looking newsletter/newspaper. The goal of this club is to combine art, computers, and photography into one. This club will be run by Miss. Duchon.

In the nature club, we will be exploring both plants and animals. In the spring, we will be doing some planting and caring for seedlings. Based on student interest and availability, we could ask Lisa Meadow from the Yellow Creek Learning center to come to the school to present to the students about a particular animal species or other topic of interest. This club will be run by Mrs. Partida.

Stem Club is a great and fun way to explore different aspects of science, technology, engineering, and math. We will work together with classmates to create and construct projects and hands-on activities. This may include things such as conducting a variety of experiments, constructing and building projects, and possibly having guest speakers. In STEM Club you will be having so much fun, you won't even realize that you are also learning. This club will be run by Mrs. McCracken.
